This race was a tight finish for the fleet, the elapsed time gap between first to finish and the last to finish was just 20 minutes. John & Julie Conner crossed first, followed by Mac & Brent Boulet 1 minute 40 seconds later. Edward Duhe finished third, just 3

minutes 49 seconds after the Conners. When finish times were adjusted for the PHRF handicap, Mac & Brent Boulet were declared the winners, followed by the Conners and then Edward Duhe. Joe Gary and Al Lilley finished 4th & 5th respectively.

For the series, 3 races were sailed, one race was cancelled due to weather and one race was abandoned

when the wind died. Congratulations to Mac & Brent Boulet, who won the series in their Pearson 365, followed by John & Julie Conner, Edward Duhe, Joe Gary and Al Lilley.
