Also, kindly remember that all dry storage and in water boats must be insured for liability and a copy of your current binder must be provided to Al Lilley, our harbor master, along with up to date contact information. Wind and weather had an impact on the 4th & 5th races of the Rosemary Lucas Cup: the 4th race on 4/30/16 was cancelled due to stormy conditions while the 5th race on 5/14/16 started with 5 boats on a pretty day in light winds but was abandoned after an hour of pleasant floating when light wind turned into no wind.

Therefore, scoring for the Rosemary Lucas Cup series

was based on the results of the 1st 3 races with 9 skippers participating in at least 1 race. Results: 1st to Matt Guenther, 2nd to Butch Nolan, 3rd to Joe Gary, 4th to Mac Boulet & 5th to Ed Duhe. Congratulations to Matt and all the skippers, crew and supporting cast who participated in the series.

The 2nd "Round the Bay" race held on 5/28/16 started

with 3 crews heading SW across Vermilion Bay in light to moderate wind, almost to Southwest Pass, turning N to a mark off of Blue Point before finishing at the Tower just off the Point. The estimated distance was over 20 miles. Race took a little over 4 1/2 hours. Results: 1st to Butch Nolan, 2nd to Al Lilley and 3rd to John Conner.

Sunfish Program by Bill Whitehead

School is out for the summer and if you are looking for a fun activity for the kids and grandkids, let me recommend the Junior Sunfish Sailing Camp at CYC scheduled for Friday, July 15, Saturday, July 16, and Sunday, July 17, 2016. This will be a day camp geared for juniors 8 to 14 years old. Catherine (7th grade) said she liked the camp because she was "able to get actual hands on experience sailing a sunfish without interference from her dad". And she had fun! We typically divide the juniors into 2 groups : new or younger juniors and juniors who have attended before and/or have some sailing

experience. After reviewing how to rig up a sunfish and some basic sailing instruction, we get out on the water with an adult accompanying the younger juniors, and the older juniors teaming up and taking turns steering or trimming the sail. Depending on wind/direction/weather, the fleet may sail an "out and back" course or practice rounding buoys. CYC provides lunch and participants who complete the camp will receive a certificate.

In addition to juniors, volunteers are needed to assist with the camp. Roles include assisting with rigging and launching boats, on-

water instruction, chase boats, and help preparing and serving lunch to the juniors. The club has several sunfish but we typically can use a couple more, so let us know if you have a sunfish you can loan to the club for the camp.

We are going to do our best to make sure everyone has fun and learns a little about sailing too!
