The time (of day) a boat finishes minus the time the race started equals the *Elapsed Time*, which must be converted into seconds.  
 The *Elapsed Time* minus the *Time Allowance*, which is the product of the *PHRF Rating* multiplied by the distance, equals the *Corrected Time*. The lowest *Corrected Time* wins.

### A Note from our Race Chairman, Paul Stutes....

It has been a fun year of sailing and each new boat that joins a race adds to the excitement. It also makes the program much easier to run knowing there is a high probability there'll be enough boats for a race. Thanks to everyone who participated. The afternoon starts in the summer have also helped getting races off due to a more consistent breeze. Hopefully we will figure out a plan for the silt in harbor as we have several boats that regularly become land locked.

For next year I'd like to encourage all the racers to get an official GYA PHRF certificate. The application may seem intimidating at first but it's not that hard to do. If your boat is a standard production model, which I think most of us are, all the measurement data you need is available online. If not we can help hold the end of the tape for some quick measurements. The fee is \$45 for a two year certificate, they all expire 12/31/2024. The fee is pro-rated as the time period progresses. So if you procrastinate just a little longer until January 2024, you can get an official certificate for \$25. You don't have to renew and this would give us an official level playing field for scoring the races. Looking forward to another year of fun and hope to see ten boats on the line. Paul Stutes

## House and Grounds Report - John Conner

We have several things which need to be addressed at the club. I have removed the old no longer working TV and purchased a new 55 inch TV which I hope to install soon. A new Post for the boat ramp has been installed to restrict ramp use for members only. Several loads of used concrete have been delivered to the club and will be put on the bayside of club to protect our bulkhead.

We recently have had issues with our stove and oven. The oven has a problem staying lit after lighting the pilot light. We think that is a due to a bad thermocouple in the oven. Our propane tank for the stove recently ran out of gas. If this happens while you are using the stove turn off all valves on stove and connect one of small tanks located near the upstairs AC. There is wrench in the pantry tool box to enable you to do this.

Whoever was using the stove when we recently ran out of gas left all three valves for griddle on and left the club. I had the tanks refilled and connected the gas tank turned it on the make sure we had gas at the stove. When I got to the stove I noticed that the valves were all on. This could have been a very bad situation.

As members please take care of the club. We don't have a club manager to clean up after you. When you leave the club make sure you set AC at 80 degrees, turn off lights, turn off gas bottle, turn off downstairs AC's, if you use a hose put it back on the hanger, and lock the doors. If you have questions or concerns please call one of the board members.


